	<u>Chairman's Welcome and Public Forum</u> – the Chairman welcomed those present, with a particularly warm welcome to Mr Derek Sharpe and Mr Ray Calder, part owner of Roserrow Golf Club.	
	Mr Sharpe read extracts from a letter he had received from the Clerk and spoke, regarding the retention of a fence at Trelyn, Rock. He was aggrieved at the decision made by Cornwall Council to permit the fence to be retained and the manner in which the decision had been taken. He clarified that he did not wish Members to do anything, merely to listen to his grievance. He asked Cllr. Gisbourne about the video, which was shown to the Planning Committee and he was told that this would have been returned to the former NCDC. It was explained that the fence would be removed as soon as the hedge has reached the agreed height.	
	Mr Calder introduced himself and said everyone had been most supportive since he and his partner had taken over the Golf Club. They wished to work closely with the Parish Council and the local community. He sought the views of Members as to what they would wish to see on the site and indicated that they will be holding a series of Open Evenings, the first of which will be on 11 th April 2011 at 7pm. Cllr. Taper would like to see affordable housing and a public road through Roserrow. They will be reviewing the existing planning permissions.

Claire advised that if alarms are ringing excessively, it should be reported to the Police and CC's Environment Agency. b. County Council – Cllr. Gisbourne spoke regarding the standardisation of car parking charges. c. St Minver Highlands Parish Council – a copy of the February Minutes were made available at the Meeting. d. Padstow Harbour Commission – a copy of the January Minutes were made available at the Meeting. e. Parish Plan Committee – Members considered an email from Mr David Short. A further meeting was scheduled for 17th March and Cllrs. Mould and Taper will attend. Cllr. Taper will enquire if someone from the Community Network can attend. f. PA11/01035, Sundowners, Rock – extension of time of 2008/00881, for the demolition of existing single storey dwelling and erection of new two storey dwelling house including repositioning of the inground swimming pool approved on 18th June 2008. 33/2011	 Traffic Matters a. Community Speedwatch – Minute 20c/2011 refers. The meeting scheduled for 25th February 2011 had not gone ahead. No further action at this stage. b. Highway Surfaces – Minute 20d/2011 refers. Members received an update, regarding: Penmayne – Cllr. Mould reported that the state of the road is appalling. The Clerk to invite Mr Brian Doney to visit the site with Members. Trewiston Lane – the Clerk to report the potholes from the junction with Rock Road to Trewiston Lodge Nursing Home; and to remind Mr Doney that the promised "slow down" sign near the Home has not been installed. Daymer Lane – the Clerk to report that the road sign at the top of the lane needs to be cleaned. Members were concerned at the advice received. The Police arrived and agenda item 31a/2011 was taken at this point Cllr. Gisbourne reported that Highways had not planned to begin the consultation on the yellow lining until April. He had complained vociferously. He asked if Members knew of any traffic incidents on Trewint Lane, as he was considering the installation of "dragon's teeth". Members supported this proposal. Road Closure – Trenint Hill and Worthy Hill, Trebetherick will be closed for patching works (24 hours a day) from 14 th to 18 th March.
